

**OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(CHARLBURY AREA)
(SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 202***

The Oxfordshire County Council, in exercise of its powers under Sections 82 & 84 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Oxfordshire County Council (Charlbury Area) (Speed Limits) Order 202* and shall come into force on the day of 202*.
2. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
4. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.
5. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 4 to this Order.
6. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to a vehicle falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011, being a vehicle used for naval, military or air force purposes, when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those regulations.
7. The Oxfordshire County Council (Charlbury Area) (Speed Limits) Order 2020 is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE 1

20mph speed limit:

The whole length of every road in Charlbury extending, in the case of the respective roads leading out of the town to the following points:

a)	Hixet Wood	a point 102 metres north of its junction with Five Ways
b)	Grammar School Hill	a point 115 metres south of its junction with Clarendon Court
c)	Market Street	its junction with Dyers Hill / Thames Street

d)	Nine Acres Lane	a point 86 metres west of its junction with Enstone Road
e)	B4022 Banbury Hill	a point 75 metres north of its junction with Hundley Way
f)	Ditchley Road	a point 170 metres northeast of its junction with Kearsey Court
g)	B4022 The Slade	a point 28 metres south of its junction with Ditchley Road
h)	Dancers Hill	its junction with B4022 Sturt Road

SCHEDULE 2

30mph speed limit:

The whole length of every road in Charlbury (*excluding those specified in Schedule 1*) extending, in the case of the respective roads leading out of the town, to the following points:

- a) B4022 Banbury Hill a point 300 metres northeast of its junction with Hundley Way.
- b) B4022 Fawler Road a point 135 metres south of its junction with the B4437 Woodstock Road.
- c) B4026 Pound Hill / **Charlbury Road** a point **410 75** metres northwest of its junction with the **B4437 Nine Acres Lane access to Watermead Farm.**
- d) B4437 Forest Road (Dyers Hill) a point 530 metres west of its junction with Church Lane.
- e) B4437 Woodstock Road point 288 metres east of the access to "The Grange".
- f) Ditchley Road a point 195 metres northeast of its junction with Quarry Lane.

SCHEDULE 3

40mph speed limit:

The B4026 between Charlbury and Spelsbury, within the Parishes of Charlbury and Spelsbury:

From a point 10 metres southeast of its junction with Back Lane, Spelsbury, southwards

a point **410 75** metres northwest of its junction with the **B4437 Nine Acres Lane access to Watermead Farm.**

SCHEDULE 4

50mph speed limit:

- a) The B4022 between Charlbury and Finstock, within the Parishes of Charlbury, Fawler and Finstock:

From a point 135 metres south of its junction with the B4437 Woodstock Road, Charlbury south-eastwards and south-westwards

to a point 230 metres northeast of its junction with School Road, Finstock.

- b) The B4437 Charlbury to Wootton, within the Parishes of Charlbury, Fawler, Spelsbury, Stonesfield, Glympton and Wootton

From a point 288 metres east of the access to `The Grange`, Charlbury, eastwards

To a point 150 metres west of the access to Grim Dyke Farm, Wootton.
