

Minutes of the Finance Committee of Charlbury Town Council

held on Wednesday 13th November 2024 At 8pm in the Green Room, Memorial Hall

- **1.** To elect a chair to the Finance Committee Gary Harrison was elected as chair for this financial year.
- 2. Apologies for Absence were received from Arthur Sinclair, Liz Reason and Frances Mortimer,
- **3. Declarations of Interest:** Ed Bradbury declared an interest in the grant applied for by Wychwood Forest Trust
- **4**. To consider increasing annual sinking fund amount for hard surface maintenance (tennis courts) It was agreed to increase the annual amount to £3000.
- 5. To consider community grant applications

As the Town Council no longer has General Power of Competence, there is less money available for community grants (under Local Government Act 1972 S137). The following contributions were agreed:

6. To consider the budget for Financial Year 2025-2026

The draft budget was examined line by line by the committee. The committee agreed a budget to recommend to the Town Council. Total income £158,820, total expenditure £152,820. It was agreed to place £6000 in reserves in line with the external auditor's request to increase the reserve level.

7. To agree amount of precept to recommend to the Town Council

It was agreed to recommend an increase of 2.84% in the precept to the Town Council in order to balance the budget (just above inflation). This equates to £2.99 per year per Band D household. It was noted that these are not the exact figures – the exact figures cannot be calculated until the tax base has been received from West Oxfordshire District Council.
