## Summary of decisions or actions requested:

The Town Council is asked to agree to

- Submit an application to Sport England to fund a second skateboard workshop
- Obtain quotes for repairing the skatepark surface with a view to including in next year's budget.

**Financial implications:** None. Skatepark workshops will be grant funded so no cost to Town Council. Quotes for repairs are just for information at this stage.

Communications: NA

The skateboard workshops at the end of April were a great success. Seventeen children attended and paid a subsidised cost of £5. The event sold out within 48 hours of it being advertised. Feedback was excellent, with 90% rating it as "excellent" and 10% as "good". See comments we received below.

I would like to run a similar event in the late summer, and I could apply for a grant from Sport England for this. I would like Town Council agreement to go ahead and apply for a grant of between £300 and £400.

The skateboarding coach commented that the damage to the surface between the ramps and the flat surface is dangerous as it could catch a wheel. This was also picked up on the last safety inspection. I would like to seek quotes for repairing the surface, with a view to including this in next year's budget.
